



YOUTH PROGRAMMING & TUTORING SUMMER 2019 | VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

BACKGROUND AND PROGRAM SCOPE

This summer we are providing a 6-hour summer program for young people who live in 3 public housing communities. We are working towards preventing “the summer slide” so our young people will be ready for the upcoming school year.

Each site in Auburn will have a different theme per week. Programming will include time for activities that build on literacy, social emotional learning skills, teamwork, and critical thinking. These experiences will happen in both indoor and outdoor spaces, as well as field trips to other locations. Each location hosts 20-40 youth per day.

Our Youth Tutoring Centers provide a safe space for youth to reach their potential as students and community members. The centers offer tutoring and innovative projects for youth aged 6 to 18 to improve academic performance and boost interpersonal social skills. Youth also have access to college and career readiness support.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist in creating a safe learning environment reflecting the diverse backgrounds of the participating youth.
- Contribute to the fulfillment of the Neighborhood House mission through providing assistance, mentorship and encouragement to students.
- Commit to 1 to 4 hours of service **consistently** per week
- Help individual students or small groups of students with academic enrichment activities, recreational activities and when applicable, provide supervision on field trips.
- Other duties as assigned

QUALIFICATIONS

- Ability to work with elementary (Kindergarten to 5th grade) and/or middle and high school aged youth in a respectful and caring manner
- Dependability and patience
- Ability to work with students from diverse backgrounds
- Ability to set and maintain clear boundaries
- Outgoing personality and high comfort level interacting with youth

- Must be able to make a **reliable and consistent** commitment
- Minimum age: 18

Positively impact the life of a youth both academically and personally with the support of Neighborhood House staff and other motivated volunteers in a group setting.
