In 2022, over 793 children and families were served, including 485 in Early Head Start (both Home Based and Center Based) and 308 in Head Start and ECEAP Preschool.

GOAL TOPIC #1 – APPROACHES TO LEARNING Children will be curious and engaged in the learning environment, and show persistence in approaching tasks.



GOAL TOPIC #2 - LANGUAGE AND LITERACY Children will increase their ability to express and comprehend language.



GOAL TOPIC #3 - COGNITION AND GENERAL KNOWLEDGE Children will utilize problem-solving strategies and known information to seek multiple solutions to a problem and to identify cause and effect relationships.



GOAL TOPIC #4 – PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT AND HEALTH
Children will increase their ability to move with direction and refined coordination and will be able to manipulate a variety of objects.



GOAL TOPIC #5 - SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT Children will demonstrate self-regulation by shifting attention between tasks, moving through transitions and self-care routines with minimal assistance, and interacting cooperatively with peers and adults.








