Our purpose is to create opportunities for people who face cultural, language, and systemic barriers to live longer, happier, and healthier lives. We envision a healthy, diverse, and welcoming community, free of poverty and racism, where all people thrive.

Our Work

Founded in 1906, Neighborhood House is one of the oldest human services agencies in King County. We work with over 15,000 people every year and address the needs of entire families, with a focus on immigrants, refugees, low-income community members, and public housing residents. Our programs and services include:

- Early childhood education, including preschool, toddler classrooms, and home visiting.
- Youth development and tutoring centers for kids and teens.
- Community health treatment and prevention for substance use, mental health, and communicable disease.
- Job training and placement programs for adults.
- English language and citizenship preparation classes.
- Support for older adults, those with disabilities, and their caregivers.
- Rental assistance and eviction prevention.
- Multilingual and multicultural approach with staff who speak over 45 languages in locations throughout Seattle and South King County.
