



Afterschool Youth Engagement Program: K-12 Math Tutor

VOLUNTEER POSITION DESCRIPTION

BACKGROUND

Every day, Neighborhood House builds community and increases access to housing, health, education, and economic opportunities for low-income, immigrants and refugees across Seattle and King County. Since 1906, Neighborhood House has advanced our mission to partner with individuals and families to build community and increase access to housing, health, education, and economic opportunity. Our programs focus on early childhood education, youth development, employment and adult education, housing assistance, community health, and aging and disability services throughout King County, WA.

PROGRAM SCOPE

Afterschool youth engagement program supports students who may need extra help understanding math concepts, completing homework, or preparing for exams. Tutoring sessions are designed to create a safe, supportive, and engaging learning environment where students can ask questions freely and receive individualized academic support.

- Assist in homework help- there is a need for middle school and high school math support which includes algebra and geometry.
- Help create a safe welcoming space for youth to build skills, friends, and community and encourage growth mindset and a positive attitude towards math.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide one-on-one or small-group tutoring in math (elementary through high school level, depending on volunteer experience).
- Support students with homework assignments, problem-solving strategies, and test preparation.
- Encourage a growth mindset and build student confidence in math.
- Maintain consistent attendance and communication with the Youth Program Coordinator.
- Foster a welcoming and respectful learning environment that reflects Neighborhood House's values of inclusion and equity.
- Track student progress and share feedback with staff as needed.
- Participate in occasional volunteer orientations or training sessions.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Strong proficiency in math (basic arithmetic through algebra, geometry, or higher depending on age group).
- Previous tutoring, teaching, or mentoring experience preferred but not required.
- Patience, reliability, and enthusiasm for working with youth from diverse backgrounds.
- Ability to communicate clearly and encourage positive learning habits.
- Must pass a background check in accordance with Neighborhood House volunteer policies.
- Commitment to at least one tutoring session per week for a minimum of three months.

- Make a meaningful impact on a young person's academic success.
- Gain hands-on experience in education and youth development.
- Be part of a supportive and mission-driven community organization.
